Subject: WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH) IN SCHOOLS

MONITORING PROGRAM FOR SY 2020-2021

To set specific parameters and standards essential to every learner's right to access WASH in schools and learning centers nationwide, DepEd issued DO No. 10, s. 2016 - "Policy and Guidelines for the Comprehensive Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools (WinS) Program".

In line with this, Schools Division Superintendents are directed to ensure that all schools report and update their WinS status yearly by using the Three Star Approach (TSA). The WinS Reporting and Monitoring forms may be accessed through https://deped-wins.sysdb.site/Login/.

For SY 2020-2021 remote learning compliance to the Basic Education-Learning Continuity Plan (BE-LCP), please refer to the attached Guide on Filling out the WinS Monitoring Tool, and the Monitoring Form itself. FAQs related to the monitoring and submission of WinS data is also attached.

Guide on Filling out the WinS Monitoring Tool for School Year 2020-2021

To ensure the safety, health and well-being of learners as well as the teachers and other personnel, DepEd issued the Guidelines on the Required Health Standards in Basic Education Offices and Schools (DepEd Order No. 14, s. 2020). Schools are also encouraged to comply with the standards set out in the WinS Program which is at the forefront in preventing the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

While schools are currently closed, infrastructure and other mitigating measures should be in place for safe school physical reopening and operations.

Monitoring these measures seems to be a challenging task for the schools as there are indicators that are not relevant to the current context or could not be answered due to the current situation. This document provides guidance for schools on how to accomplish the monitoring tool for this school year.

Most of the questions found in the WinS monitoring tool, especially questions relating to infrastructure, are in fact answerable. However, in case of not applicable questions, we advise that you should still respond to these questions by using your data from the previous school year. But in the event that your school did not participate in previous monitoring, *leave the question blank* or put **#NA** if possible.

By doing so, this allows you to look at your own star-level in your own report card; while at the national level, we can calculate the star-ratings of schools nationwide. Data is important for providing technical assistance to the schools and for budgeting for next school year.

In answering the questions in the WinS Online Monitoring System for the school year 2020-2021 where Face-to-Face classes are not possible, please be guided by the following **Legends**:

- * Applicable/Answerable despite No Face-to-Face Classes
- ** Not Applicable/Not Answerable due to No Face-to-Face Classes, hence, last year's WinS monitoring data should be encoded. In case you did not participate last year, please leave these questions blank

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

1. When will be the deadline of submission of WinS Monitoring data for this school year?

Schools may submit their WinS monitoring data from November 2020 until the end of academic year (July 2021).

2. There are questions that are not applicable as schools are not open yet. How do the schools answer these types of questions?

The DepEd Bureau of Learner Support Services - School Health Division (BLSS-SHD) will issue a guideline on how the schools will fill out the WinS monitoring tool for school year 2020-2021. Most questions in the monitoring tool are still answerable despite schools do not offer face to face learning opportunities. However, in case of non-applicable questions (for example: How many times in a week is supervised group handwashing with soap conducted for all children in the school?), please use your data from previous year to answer these types of questions.

3. What if the schools did not participate in the WinS Monitoring last year? How are they going to answer the non-applicable questions?

In the event that the schools did not participate in the WinS Monitoring last school year, you are advised to leave the question unanswered, or if possible, just write #NA.

4. Where can I find the results of the previous rounds of WinS monitoring?

If you can no longer access your previous data, just log into the official DepEd WASH in Schools Online Monitoring system (<u>DepEd WinS OMS (sysdb.site</u>)), using your own username and password. If you have trouble accessing your account, please contact your respective division/regional coordinators. Once signed in, follow these steps:

- Under the Modules section, click the 'Generate Report'
- Specify first the school year you are interested in to look at (i.e. at this time, select SY 2019)
- Select your school level (whether elementary or secondary).
- Then, fill in the remaining fields such as your region, division, district (for ES only) and the name of your school.
- Under the Statistical Reports, click the 'WinS Database' to download your previous data

5. What if schools have already submitted their data before the implementation of the new guideline? Does the system allow resubmission of data? Will it replace the old entry?

Yes, the data to be uploaded will overwrite your previous entry. The WinS online monitoring system avoids double entries unless schools enter an incorrect school ID.

6. Can I see the data from previous years?

Yes, you can, up to a certain level. There are no PowerBI based dashboards for viewing WINS monitoring data at the individual school level. But there are WINS monitoring dashboards at SDO level. These can be found at the following websites:

7. Are schools required to submit their WinS data this school year?

As indicated in the DepEd Order No. 194, s. 2018 entitled "Implementing Guidelines to DepEd Order No. 10, s. 2016 (Policy and Guidelines for Comprehensive Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools Program), the CO, ROs, SDOs, and all public schools are tasked to ensure utilization of and compliance to the global concept of Three Star Approach (TSA) indicators thru the WinS Online Monitoring System (WinS OMS).

The result of the WinS OMS shall serve as basis for planning, policy direction, and provision of WinS interventions.

8. Are there any changes in the WinS Monitoring tool since we are in the midst of a pandemic and as there are no face-to-face classes held?

No, there are no changes in the tool. Please refer to the Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools (WinS) Program Monitoring for School Year 2020-2021 and the guidelines issued by the Department of Education.

9. How can we assist schools in accessing their WinS monitoring account especially when they forgot their username and password?

Bring this up to the regional or division ICT coordinators as they have been given access to 'Manage schools' feature of the online monitoring system. In case you were not able to get support at Division or Regional level please email your concerns directly to technical persons within BLSS-SHD (deped.wins.help@gmail.com)

10. In case of integrated schools, should they send two WinS data one for elementary and one for secondary?

Yes, this has been the protocol since the implementation of WinS monitoring. During the orientation of the WinS monitoring, integrated schools were advised to submit two sets of WinS data: one for elementary level and one for secondary level. Be sure to indicate or tick the correct school level in the WinS monitoring tool.



11. How to verify if the data submitted by all schools under our SDOs or region have been entered already into the system?

It's easy to verify. Just log in to the official DepEd WASH in Schools Online Monitoring system (DepEd WinS OMS (sysdb.site), using your own username and password. If you have trouble accessing your account, please contact your respective division/regional coordinators. Take these steps once signed in:

- Click 'Modules' and then click 'Generate Reports'
- Under the Generate Report screen, select the school year you are interested in to explore.
- Indicate whether you want to look at either elementary or secondary.
- Specify in the 'Summarize by' whether you want to see the whole region or just a particular SDO.
- Indicate your Region but in case of SDO, indicate your both region and SDO
- Leave the School District and School sections blank
- Generate the data by clicking 'WinS Database' under the Statistical Reports
- Open the excel file (xls) generated and check if all schools under your SDO or regions have encoded their WinS data already.
- Repeat the process for Secondary Schools
