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# BANGON MARAWI EDUCATION CANNOT WAIT. EDUCATION MUST CONTINUE

he Case of Marawi City, as with most government agencies, is how to be able to fully rebuild lost infrastructure during the armed siege. For the Department of Education (DepEd), however, it is more than just repairing and rebuilding classrooms, but how we can bring normalcy back to our students' lives.

Education Secretary Leonor Briones was also caught in the middle of a war back in her childhood, when she and her family fled to the mountains to steer clear of the fighting. The Secretary was fortunate however that she was spared from the worst of the war, because her mother would gather all the children in the area and would teach them how to read, count, and write. In hindsight, it was these lessons that helped her get through the conflict back then.

Recently at the United Nations General Assembly, Secretary Briones said that whatever challenges the Filipinos are facing as a country, education must continue. And in its effort to continue on with the education of the students, DepEd is now in the midst of undertaking a massive drive "Bangon Marawi. Education Cannot Wait. Education Must Continue." as our contribution to the national and overall rebuilding program.

# TULOY EDUKASYON: TUGON SA MARAWI



- As of 5 October, 31,393 displaced learners are enrolled in various schools all over the country. Out of this total, Region X hosts the biggest number with a total of 16,734; 6,820 are enrolled in schools in the division of Lanao del Norte; 5,145 are in schools of the division of Cagayan de Oro City.
- There are 12,020 displaced learners enrolled in schools in the ARMM; 8,548 are in schools of the division of Lanao del Sur 1; and 3,206 are enrolled in schools in the division of Lanao del Sur 2.
- 2,639 displaced learners are enrolled in schools of other regions in the country (CAR, NCR, NIR, Region I, II, III, 4A, V, VI, VII, IX, XI, XII, and CARAGA).





To further support learning continuity, 60 tents from partners, which serve as temporary learning space, have been installed in the receiving schools where displaced learners could no longer be accommodated in the existing classrooms due to excess of required number of learners per class/classroom.

In addition, the displaced learners have been/continue to be provided with learners' kits or school supplies from donors, including DepEd regional and division offices all over the country. As of 5 October, 19,092 sets of learners' kits/school supplies have been provided to displaced learners in Lanao del Sur 1 and 2, Lanao del Norte, Iligan City, Cagayan de Oro City, and even Marawi City.

To underscore peace building during response, messages of hope from students in various schools, mostly in Region X, have been generated and distributed to displaced learners together with the school supplies. Messages of hope have also been given to our soldiers. A total of 9,700 school furniture, particularly chairs and armchairs (for 106 schools), 9,719 hygiene kits, and slippers have also been provided by DepEd-ARMM and donors.

Universal school feeding for all learners are being provided in receiving schools in Saguiaran, Lanao del Sur 1; while feeding for displaced learners are also being provided in Iligan City.

To enable learners and personnel to cope with the impacts of the crisis, Psychological First Aid continues to be provided by DepEd and its partners.

 As of 7 October, 13,724 displaced learners have undergone PFA provided by trained DepEd guidance counselors, nurses, and personnel of Region X and ARMM.

- A total of 14,000 packs of nutri-biscuits have been distributed for the snack of learners during PFA sessions in the schools divisions of Iligan City, Lanao del Norte, Lanao del Sur I and II, and Marawi City.
- To date, 1,284 Marawi teachers, out of 1,411, have been tracked. Out of these, 881 teachers have undergone PFA, as of 12 October. Weekly PFA sessions are conducted for more than 100 teachers. The Office of the President has committed to provide fund support for three (3) batches of PFA for our Marawi teachers.



A total of 674 Marawi teachers, as of 21 September, have been deployed to the receiving schools. Teachers' kits, umbrellas, and slippers from partners and donors have been/are being provided to them.

DepEd's External Partnership Service (EPS) is busy mobilizing education partners to address the needs of displaced learners and personnel. Delivery of donations from the Central Office to Iligan City and Cagayan de Oro has been/are made possible with the assistance of the Philippine Navy, Philippine Coast Guard, and PAL.

To augment donations, the DepEd Central Office downloaded the amount of PhP 17,753,150 to the divisions of Lanao del Norte, Iligan City, and Cagayan de Oro City to procure additional learners' kits, armchairs, teachers' kits, including instructional materials, cleaning kits, water jugs and blackboards for receiving schools and deployed teachers.

part from the daily activities, DepEd is also preparing for its run of the "Brigada Eskwela sa Marawi" once the go ahead has been given by the proper authorities. This activity normally happens before the start of classes where volunteers en masse do minor repairs of the classrooms, clean the surrounding area, and encourage children to enroll and study.

The Brigada Eskwela will cover five (5) sectors, with each sector composed of a number of public schools that are closely-located for better access. Each sector will be adopted by a Mindanao Regional Office (Mindanao RO) and a DepEd-ARMM SDO, with each school paired with Schools Division Offices (SDO) of the adoptive Mindanao RO. The SDO will take charge of the mobilization of manpower for the conduct of the Brigada in close coordination with the school principal.

Meanwhile, a Luzon/Visayas Regional Office (RO) will then adopt a Mindanao RO, with four (4) Luzon/Visayas SDOs twinned to the paired school and Mindanao SDOs. These division offices will be mobilizing resources, materials and supplies for the conduct of the Brigada.

With the pairing of Marawi Schools with Mindanao ROs and SDOs and DepEd-ARMM SDOs, and the twinning of these pairs with Luzon and Visayas ROs and SDOs, the Brigada becomes a national undertaking and a Bayanihan of the education sector.

To recap, each sector will have 1 Mindanao RO with its SDOs 1 DepEd-ARMM SDO, 2 Luzon/Visayas ROs, and a number of Luzon/Visayas SDOs. The Mindanao RO and its SDOs and DepEd-ARMM SDO will handle the manpower on the ground, while the Luzon/Visayas SDOs will mobilize resources, materials, and supplies.

In addition, one (1) engineer (Division Engineer) and one DRRM coordinator will be assigned for each school to help with the assessment, and to assist during the conduct of the Brigada.


Civil society organizations, business, church, international communities and other partners can then join in the twinning by selecting the school and division that they would be supporting.

raditionally after the Brigada Eskwela, what follows is the Oplan Balik Eskwela, which aims to address commonly encountered problems at the start of the school year and ensures that learners are properly enrolled and will be able to attend school on the first day of classes. Concerns may include issues arising from student transferees, classroom assignments, questions on the voucher program, among others.

Action Centers will be setup in each sector to operationalize the OBE for Marawi headed by the Division Office, with support and supervision from DepEd-ARMM.

part from the five (5) sectors covered by the Brigada Eskwela, the Central Office and DepEd-ARMM will separately engage an additional sixth sector composed of 22; 20 of which have been confirmed to have been bombed, burned and heavily damaged. Each of the 22 school sites will be paired with a partner or group of partners for the rebuilding of the schools.

Two (2) engineers and one DRRM coordinator shall be assigned for each of the 22 schools to assess the site and prepare the necessary plans for the rebuilding.

And for schools assessed to have sustained total or major damages and requiring rebuilding from the ruins or massive repairs and construction, we are actively pursuing partners for our "Adopt-A-School in Marawi" program.

• As of 5 October, 20 schools have been severely or totally damaged. The schools have been damaged, burned, or bombed. Meanwhile, the two (2) remaining schools in sector six (6) are within the ground zero of the armed conflict but have no confirmed reports of damages, according to DepEd-ARMM.

# ALS SA MARAWI

Consistent with its mandate to bring education to all learners regardless of their circumstances, as part of the expansion of the Alternative Learning System (ALS), the Department is bringing ALS to the displaced residents of Marawi

Until the conflict in Marawi is resolved, DepEd will offer ALS to displaced out of school youth and adults who are in evacuation centers. The intervention will include psychological first aid and peace education, on top of the regular literacy program.

### **Program components:**

- Training of ALS teachers in Region 10, Region 12 and ARMM on psychological first aid and education in emergencies
- Mapping of potential learners, advocacy and social mobilization for support to the program
- Delivery of ALS for out of school youth and adults in evacuation centers/Marawi

We are very fortunate to have passionate and dependable teachers, personnel and partners who are willing to do what they can to continue the education of our children. With these activities in the pipeline, however, we can all ensure that our students are able to come to class with books, and pencils, and paper, and more than just a roof over their heads.

DepEd's "Bangon Marawi. Education Cannot Wait. Education Must Continue." Projects are led by the Office of the Undersecretary for Administration (OUA) in partnership with the DRRMS, EPS, DepEd-ARMM, and Regional Offices, but the entire department and all offices are mobilized from the Central Office down to the division offices and

ue to the recent incidents of violence and armed conflict in Marawi City and the bombings and firefights near schools in Mankayan Town in Benguet, both of which resulted in the disruption of classes, the Department deems it essential and timely to reiterate DO 44. S. 2015 or the **Declaration of Schools** as Zones of Peace xxx.

In the case of Marawi City, where as much as 20,000 students are believed to be displaced, the Department has initiated interventions to accommodate these students by extending enrollment until the end of June, and waiving the usual documentary requirements. DepEd believes that education must never stop, and instead should continue for these children to provide them hope, and bring back a sense of normalcy.

Worldwide, schools are universally treated as neutral zones despite being in the middle of areas of intense armed conflict, and are free from the presence of armed combatants regardless of what side they are from. It is imperative that this point be stressed, and that our schools be accorded the same respect - that schools are places for learning, caring, and nurturing. A true second home for our students.

Apart from reiterating the aforementioned DO, DepEd is also initiating a Nationwide awareness campaign anchored on **Schools as Zones of Peace.** Xxx All schools are instructed to post the official tarpaulin designs sized 3 by 8 feet (attached) declaring schools as Zones of Peace, at least on two on both sides of the school front gate, and on all other sides of or around the school to make the message prominent and noticeable. Xxx


NE Carawi ARMM CMC Snapshot on Marawi Crisis (As of 5PM, Aug 1, 2017)

### **Tracking of Student Transferees from Marawi City**







### **OBJECTIVES:**

The Objectives of these guidelines are to:

- 1. Provide directions on the expected outputs of the nationwide bayanihan in response to Marawi;
- 2. Define roles and responsibilities that will contribute to the smooth implementation of the activity;
- 3. Serve as reference for the step by step processes to all education stakeholders; and.
- 4. Establish communication and coordination lines to ensure maximum participation and engagement of all.

### APPROACH:

The Brigada Eskwela will be a nationwide effort with the Department mobilizing its various units including regions and divisions in Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao. DepEd will also coordinate efforts from various international and national organizations who are willing to provide support to this undertaking through its Adopt-a-School Program or through any general contribution that will benefit the schools.

### **EXPECTED OUTPUT:**

As agreed during the Cagayan de Oro meeting, the over-all objective is to create an atmosphere such that school children will forget the trauma of the crisis. This shall be done by conducting minor repairs including repainting and to project the school as a safe area where learners can continue learning and can feel that it is a happy and beautiful place to stay.

### **PROCUREMENT CENTERS:**

The suggested procurement centers which have the stocks of materials and are accessible and are near Marawi City are the following:

- Iligan City in the northern part
- 2. Pagadian City in the eastern part
- 3. Cotabato City in the southern part
- 4. Cagayan de Oro City, in the northern part but because of distance, this is an option if availability of materials in Iligan are not sufficient to supply the need.

Alternatively, the Mindanao Regional Offices who will be supporting the clusters may use their own procurement centers and deliver the materials to Marawi City prior to the conduct of the activity.



### **ACTIVITY PERIOD:**

- October 9 to 10 Start Up Activity (delivery of Brigada materials, National, Regional and Division volunteers going to the 12 schools for the activity)
- October 11 to 14 Actual Conduct of the Brigada Eskwela (Division and schools with the community finishing and completing the remaining works not completed during the start up activity)

### **COMMAND CENTERS:**

Each Marawi City sector has an identified command center. The center shall serve as staging area, temporary storage site (if needed) for all Brigada Eskwela materials prior to distribution. A sector secretariat shall be stationed where coordination of all activities in different schools will be taking place. In case of emergency, the Center shall serve as immediate response center and be considered as evacuation center during the Brigada activities. There will be security personnel that will be on standby at the Center.

### **SPECIAL ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES:**

### The DepEd-Central Office shall:

- 1. Provide overall guidance and direction through the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office:
- 2. National campaign to promote the activity in order to gather nationwide support;
- Over-all coordination and linkage with the regional offices for support, i.e.; directory of all focal persons

### THE DEPED-CENTRAL OFFICE SHALL:

- Prepare the program of work and estimates of materials and labor requirements through their respective engineers;
- 2 Support the Brigada Eskwela activities within the sector in coordination with an assigned Marawi City Division, DepEd-ARMM Division focal person and recipient School Head;
- Coordinate with the twinned regions and divisions on the estimated costs of the Brigada materials needed and timelines of the activities:
- Receive and manage the financial support from twinned regions and divisions for the procurement of materials and supplies needed;
- Procure materials, supplies, and other services needed including transportation and handling of materials to assigned schools;
- 6 Assign support personnel to manage procurement, delivery, deployment of volunteers during the actual schedule:
- 7 Assign at least 3 personnel that will provide technical guidance on the proper handling, application of painting materials; minor repair works; etc. based on the program of works;
- 8 Provide other form of assistance which will come from within the region and division offices;
- 9 Prepare and submit Financial Report to twinned region and divisions.

### THE DEPED-CENTRAL OFFICE SHALL:

- Raise financial resources based on the estimated cost of the proposed interventions as prepared by the paired Mindanao region;
- 2 Send other assistance based on the specific wish of the assigned school;
- 3 Receive financial report from Mindanao Paired regions and divisions.

### THE DEPED-ARMM REGIONAL OFFICE SHALL:

- Provide over-all support to Marawi City Division in the preparation, planning, implementation and post activities;
- Deploy its engineering team to support the engineers coming from the Mindanao Paired regions and divisions.
- Provide guidance to the ARMM school divisions to support the activity and assists the Marawi City Division:
- 4 Support the travel expenses of its personnel to be deployed to the activity.
- Prepare and distribute the School Profiles of all schools based on the latest school facilities inventory, eBEIS data, number of teachers, maps, and other data that would help the Paired regions and divisions to come up with a package of assistance;



- Come up with menu of proposed assistance as reference of the paired and twinned divisions;
- Encourage and campaign for CSOs and other ARMM regional offices (government and private) to support and participate through provisions of materials and volunteers during the activity;
- Maintain the Marawi Crisis interactive map and the FaceBook account for information sharing;
- Interface with Central Office to ensure the success of the implementation.


### THE MARAWI CITY DIVISION:

The Division Office shall be in-charge for the following:

- Security arrangements with the Armed Forces of the Philippines through the Task Force Marawi who in turn be responsible for:
  - a. Clearance of the area prior to the activity;
  - Provision of security support during the duration of the activity to facilitate the entry of DepEd personnel, volunteers, and materials.
  - Provision of labor support during the conduct of the activity
- Serve as the Over-all Coordination and Communication Center
  - Arrange for the participation of the uniformed personnel, if available
  - Organize and prepare all personnel that will be involved in the activity such as but not limited to organizing a Welcoming Group; Guide Group for the entry of the Regional and Divisions volunteers;
  - Prepare for a simple and short kick off programme to highlight the event;
  - d. Campaign for and ensure the participation and support of the local government, parents, CSOs and other organizations from the community; Provide immediate assistance for any eventualities in all schools
- Oversee the preparation of the target schools by conducting planning, meeting and orientation with the community on the activity

### THE RECIPIENT SCHOOLS SHALL:

- Organize and mobilize the Parent-Teacher Association and the community to support the activity;
- Conduct meeting with parents and community officials to plan for the activity by forming committees that will do specific tasks before, during and after the activity;
- The School Head shall interface with Paired Division focal person in the preparation of program of works and other required information;
- Coordinate with local authorities for security;
- Secure at least 3 ladder and basic carpentry tools;

ost-Conflict Needs Assessment (PCNA) is required to be conducted by the Task Force Bangon Marawi member-agencies (DepEd included) to ensure that the needs resulting from the armed conflict may be evaluated and provided with appropriate interventions.

The Armed Forces of the Philippines and Joint Task Group Ranao, on October 3, 2017, declared the cluster of barangays 0-12 as cleared and ready for the conduct of PCNA. These cleared barangays contain 35 schools which would open after the conduct of the PCNA. Earlier on September 5, 2017, 12 schools have already been cleared to open.

The Brigada Eskwela sa Marawi (BESM) will be implemented in all of the 47 schools once the clearance of the AFP to enter the areas concerned is given.

In light of this, the following are advised:

### 01

All regional and division twins/pairs are encouraged to immediately start mobilizing, delivering, and/or prepositioning resources needed for the BESM as well as organizing the necessary manpower to implement the discussed plans;

### 02

The hub for all prepositioned goods for the BESM shall be directed to the Amai Pakpak Central Elementary School, Datu Akader St., Brgy. Buadi Sacayo Green, Marawi City;

### 03

Before the delivery of the aforementioned resources, twinned/paired Regions and Divisions must first coordinate with Marawi City Division's Assistant Schools Division Superintendent, Ana Zenaida Unte, through email address annazenaidaunte@gmail.com and/or cellphone number (0917) 718-1159 to ensure the proper and timely clearance by the AFP of the goods for delivery to the said hub;

### 04

The DRRMS will provide the number of personnel to be allowed by the AFP for the conduct of the BESM as per security protocols;

Some schools of Marawi City have already submitted their wish lists and are also attached to this memorandum circular for reference of the concerned twins/pairs;

### 06

The wish lists of the remaining schools shall be provided once submitted by DepEd-ARMM;
