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SCHOOL-BASED FEEDING PROGRAM 2021 UPDATE

The Department of Education (DepEd) has continued the implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP), noting its relevance in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic and the challenges it has presented.

- **3,517,807 pupils** from Kindergaten to Grade 6 nationwide were the beneficiaries of the SBFP's Nutritious Food Products (NFP) component; and
- **3,136,951 pupils** were provided milk through the SBFP's milk component.




Figure 1: Target and Actual Number of Beneficiaries

These numbers represent a 205.9% achievement for NFP and 176.69% for milk of the 1,775,349 beneficiaries (See **Figure 1:** Target and Actual Number of Beneficiaries)

The SBFP consists of the provision of nutritious food products and fresh or sterilized milk with a total fund allocation of P5.97 Billion for school year 2020-2021 (See **Table 1** for fund allocation and regional distribution). It aims to:

- (i) address hunger and encourage learners to enroll;
- (ii) contribute to the improvement of their nutritional status;
- (iii) provide nourishment for their growth and development and help boost their immune system, and
- (iv) enhance and improve their health and nutrition values.

The program is in compliance with RA 11037, otherwise known as the *Masustansyang Pagkain para sa Batang Pilipino Act* signed by Pres. Rodrigo Duterte on June 20, 2018. The law provides for the inclusion of fresh milk or fresh milk-based products in the SBFP as additional component to hot meals. The Bayanihan to Heal as One Act also provides for the augmentation of the SBFP budget for school year 2020.

For the fresh milk component, DepEd has partnered with the Philippine Carabao Center (PCC) and the National Dairy Authority (NDA) along with the support of various cooperatives and small and medium enterprises (SMEs) engaged in dairy business. This is pursuant to the mandates of RA No. 11037 and in accordance with Republic Act No. 8172, otherwise known as the "Philippine Food Fortification Act of 2000", utilizing, as far as practicable, locally produced milk in order to enhance its nutritional content and, at the same time, help boost livelihood opportunities for local dairy farmers and local dairy industry. More than 80% of fresh milk requirement were supplied thru PCC and NDA while 20% were from commercial sources and through donations from the private sector. Likewise, DepEd has also tapped cooperatives and small and medium enterpris (SME) producers of nutritious food products, particularly those assisted and accredited by the Food and Nutrition Research Institute (FNRI) of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST).

As of December 2020,

- 34,771 schools implemented the Nutritious Food Products component while
- **33,732 schools** included the Fresh Milk component.

With the challenges brought by the pandemic, DepEd adopted and innovated strategies to implement the SBFP following all standard health protocols. Due to deferment of face to face classes, most of the schools directly distributed the food and milk items to the homes of the beneficiaries.




Figure 2: Sources of Fresh/Sterilized Milk

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For school year 2021-2022, DepEd will sustain the implementation of the program with another **P6B allocation**.

To further strengthen institutional arrangements for the implementation of SBFP, DepEd will continue partnering with concerned national government agencies (e.g. PCC, NDA, NNC, FNRI) and local government units. Moreover, DepEd will tap more farmers cooperatives and SMEs to supply the nutritious food and fresh milk. DepEd will continuously promote SBFP's objectives, especially its contribution to the national campaign against hunger and poverty, and support local dairy industries and local food processing in the country.

Under the new normal and the blended distance learning mode, DepEd intensified its partnership and collaboration with the local government units in the distribution of nutritious food and milk packs directly to the homes of the learners. In areas where parents and/or guardians go to schools to pick up self learning modules and/or to

submit accomplished work sheets of their children, food and milk ration for one week are also distributed to them.
