- 8. Participate in any post-training activities including, but not limited to, surveys, focus group discussions, community of practice, and peer mentoring, subject to my availability.



Project Rationale

The Philippines had long responded to the call for climate education, pursuant to the Republic Act 9729 or the Climate Change Act of 2009. The Enhanced Basic Education Act of 2013 strengthened curriculum integration of key climate change concepts across grade levels. However, there is a gap between the formal curriculum and the learned curriculum.

While the competencies are already embedded in the curriculum, there is no monitoring of the actual delivery of these competencies.





Based on initial focus group discussions in DepEd DRRMS' Change the Current (CTC) activity, the development of a Biodiversity Toolkit for Teachers, and development of the Handbook for Teachers, aside from climate change competencies, teachers try to integrate climate change in other subjects.

However, the connection of concepts to climate change adaptation and mitigation is not formed. The impacts discussed are always related to typhoons and solid waste management. Teachers also reported a lack of mastery in climate change topics to effectively make connections to what is being experienced by the students.

With the much-needed training course for Filipino teachers, YSEALI Climate Changemakers aims to enable teachers to effectively teach climate change competencies, integrate climate change in other competencies, and commit to climate action.





YSEALI Climate Changemakers is an online training course that aims to increase the competence of teachers in teaching climate change concepts and encouraging learners to act on climate. It consists of one core training subject on introduction to climate change and a specialized training subject on teaching climate change.

Training Details

The participants are from the Divisions of Sorsogon City, Iloilo City, Eastern Samar, Surigao Del Sur, and Apayao of Regions V, VI, VIII, XIII, and CAR.

There will be 50 regional and division DepEd personnel who will be trained as learning facilitators for the 2,000 teachers who will be the pilot participants..

Participants were selected based on the most vulnerable areas to climate change as identified by the Philippine Cabinet Cluster on CCAM-DRR.

Develop an online training course pack on:



Introduction to climate change



Teaching climate change

There are three (3) training courses:

A core subject on an introduction to climate change 2

A specialized subject for teaching climate change

3

A supplemental course for the online learning facilitators

Both subjects will end with a capstone project, a personal/family/school action plan for the core subject and a daily lesson log with climate change integration for the specialized subject.
