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AIDE MEMOIRE (UPDATED)

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URGENT NEED TO INCREASE FUNDS FOR THE DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE PROGRAM

The Department of Education (DepEd) - Disaster Preparedness and Response Program (DPRP) funds under the General Appropriations Act (GAA) is used for preparedness, prevention and mitigation, and response, rehabilitation and recovery programs for the public education sector. The 2021 National Expenditure Program allocates P124,890,000 for DPRP funds; **this amount is very insufficient**.

As such for 2021, DepEd has requested an amendment of P730,892,340.00 to fully fund regular programs, projects, and activities on preparedness, prevention and mitigation, and response, rehabilitation and recovery. Other funding requirements must also be addressed to allow for response interventions following Super Typhoon (STY) "Rolly" and Typhoon (TY) "Ulysses", amounting to P44,576,389,556.22. In sum, P45,307,281,896.22 is requested on top of the current National Expenditure Program (NEP) allocation.

I. The Disaster Preparedness and Response Program

The preparedness, prevention and mitigation programs of the DPRP funds cover various programs, projects and activities such as capacity building, development and printing of modules and Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials, conduct of advocacy campaign and conferences, planning and evaluation workshops, and procurement projects cutting across the major programs and key result areas of the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Service (DRRMS).

In practice, majority of the DPRP funds are used to implement response and early recovery programs, particularly the construction of Temporary Learning Space (TLS), clean-up and minor repairs, and provision of learners' and teachers' kits, hygiene kits, mobilization fund, and Psychological First Aid (PFA). Faced with budgetary constraints, addressing infrastructure damage through TLS construction is prioritized over other forms of assistance such as teachers' and learners' kits.

Funding to cover non-infrastructure damages are expected from the regular budget of other concerned DepEd offices (e.g., Bureau of Learning Resources for learning resources, Information and Communications Technology Service for computer packages, Education Facilities Division for school furniture). However, the procurement of resources for replacement and/or buffer stocks is budgeted for the next fiscal year. As a result, the intervention is not implemented immediately within the post-disaster period when it is most urgently needed. The need to prepare or pre-position replacement resources to allow immediate response is thus recognized.

II. Proposed Increase to the Disaster Preparedness and Response Program

Given this, it is proposed that the funds for the DPRP be increased and that this now cover the pre-positioning of response and early recovery interventions on top of the DPRP's current coverage.

The increase in budget is envisioned to (a) enable the timely and complete provision of response and early recovery interventions necessary to ensure learning continuity and the prompt return to normalcy, including the immediate replacement of damaged non-infrastructure materials and equipment through prepositioning and buffer stockpiling; and (b) strengthen capacities for disaster preparedness and prevention and mitigation.

The increase in budget for the 2021 DPRP shall allow for the following: (1) completing response and early recovery interventions for 2020 disasters, particularly Super Typhoon (STY) "Rolly" and Typhoon (TY) "Ulysses"; (2) prepositioning of replacement non-infrastructure materials and equipment for 2021 disasters; and (3) disaster preparedness, and prevention and mitigation programs.

- 1. Completing Response and Early Recovery Interventions for STY "Rolly" and TY "Ulysses". This covers the replacement of damaged School Furniture (SF), Learning Resources (LRs) and DepEd Computerization Package (DCP); and provision of needed response interventions such as Clean-Up and Minor Repair Funds, Learners' Kits and Teachers' Kits, based on the DepEd DRRMS Rapid Assessment of Damages Report (RADaR) which are yet to be delivered due to insufficient 2020 funds.
- 2. Pre-positioning of Replacements for Non-Infrastructure Materials and Equipment that may be damaged by 2021 disasters. School furniture, learning resources, computer packages and tech-voc equipment amounting to 10% of the 2020 allocation shall be procured as a buffer stock by the concerned offices (i.e., EFD, BLR, and ICTS); these may then immediately be deployed after disasters to support learning continuity. 50% of these buffer stocks shall be procured through a framework agreement, and the remaining 50% shall be procured through an ordering agreement.
- 3. Regular Disaster Response and Recovery, and Preparedness, and Prevention and Mitigation Programs. This covers the various regular programs of DRRMS for disaster response and rehabilitation (e.g., provision of Temporary Learning Spaces, clean-up and minor repair funds, provision of Learners' and Teachers' Kits, provision

Psychological First Aid), and prevention and mitigation and preparedness.

For 2022 onwards, the continued increase in DPRP funds shall be used to improve response, rehabilitation and recovery; and preparedness, and prevention and mitigation programs.

For the **response**, **rehabilitation and recovery programs**, the DPRP shall specifically be used for the following:

- 1. **Provision of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS).** This will be provided if face-to-face learning is allowed in the affected area.
- 2. **Provision of Clean-up and Minor Repair Funds.** Support funds for clean-up and minor repair are given to affected schools for immediate return to normalcy and early recovery.
- 3. Provision of temporary Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene Facilities (WaSH), as necessary. Temporary WaSH facilities are provided to ensure health and safety of DepEd personnel in schools.

- 4. **Replacement of damaged non-infrastructure materials and equipment.** Immediate replacement of damaged school furniture, learning resources, computer packages and tech-voc equipment has to be facilitated for the early return to normalcy of schools.
- 5. **Provision of support funds for mobilization.** Support funds are provided to affected divisions to address the needs for administrative and other logistical concerns.
- 6. **Provision of Learners' Kits and Teachers' Kits**. All learners and teachers have to be provided with necessary learning and teaching kits to ensure access to education even in the midst of disasters.
- 7. **Provision of Hygiene Kits.** Following the required health standards set by the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) and Department of Health (DOH), hygiene kits are also provided to ensure safety and avoid further transmission of COVID-19.
- 8. **Provision of Emergency School Feeding, as needed and as appropriate.** Learners are ensured with proper nutrition even in the midst of disasters and emergencies through the provision of emergency school feeding.
- 9. Provision of Psychological First Aid (PFA) and Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services (MHPSS). To ensure the wellbeing of both learners and DepEd personnel, psychological first aid is being provided in the aftermath of disasters and emergencies.

For Item No. 4 above - i.e., non-infrastructure materials and equipment as described above - that partakes of regular programs lodged with various DepEd offices, such as: Furniture, ICT Equipment, Math, Science and TVL Equipment, and Textbooks and other print and non-print learning resources, **these shall continue to be incorporated in the yearly expense program and procured as buffer stock amounting to 10% of the total quantities. 50% of these buffer stocks shall be procured through a framework agreement, and the remaining 50% shall be procured through an ordering agreement.** As such buffer stock, they are kept in inventory and shall be earmarked to address contingencies requiring replacement of lost or damaged items. The buffer stocks are kept (and hence has the same effect as being pre-positioned for disaster) in DepEd-controlled warehouses established under the DepEd Logistics Management System.

For Items No. 1, 6, and 7 above that are disaster-specific such as Temporary Learning Spaces (knock-down and reusable units/materials), Teachers' and Learners' Kits, and Hygiene Kits - **these may be pre-positioned and, hence, pre-procured** (i.e., procurement is done in anticipation of and to prepare for disasters). These items shall be **held in safekeeping at the DepEd-controlled warehouses** as described above and shall immediately be made available in the aftermath of a disaster. For Item No. 8 above - Special feeding in the aftermath of a disaster – this may be incorporated as "provisional sum for contingency" in the budget of the School-Based Feeding Program. This means that the amount shall be earmarked for that purpose. For purposes of determining the buffer stock quantity for such

items, the quantity for pre-procured items, as well as the provisional sum for contingency in the case of special feeding.

For the **prevention and mitigation, and preparedness programs**, the DPRP shall specifically be used for the following:

- 1. Capacitating Learners and DepEd Personnel on Disaster Preparedness, Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation (CCAM), Education in Emergencies (EiE) in Armed Conflict, and Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services (MHPSS). This involves the development of modules, manuals, and other training materials, and the conduct of capacity building for learners and DepEd personnel on the Disaster Preparedness, CCA, EiE, and MHPSS.
- 2. Strengthening the Integration of DRRM, CCAM and Peace Education in the K-12 Curriculum. This refers to the development of learning resources and capacity building to further strengthen the curriculum integration of DRRM, CCAM, and Peace Education key concepts.
- 3. **Development of Risk-informed Policies through consultation and workshops.** Risk-informed policies will be reviewed, enhanced, and/or developed, and to be issued to guide the implementation of DRRM, CCAM, EiE, and MHPSS activities across all levels of the Department. This includes the policy development of Crisis Management through Education-in-Emergencies in Armed Conflict Protocol and Formation of DRRM Teams in ROs, SDOs, and Schools.
- 4. Increasing the awareness through IEC Materials and Advocacy Campaigns. Various IEC materials in different media will be developed and disseminated to increase the awareness on DRRM, CCA, EiE, and MHPSS of learners and DepEd personnel. In addition, annual advocacy campaigns and conferences such as the National Climate Change Conference, National Disaster Resilience Month Celebration, Regional Caravans, and the Peace Month Celebration will also be conducted.
- 5. **Ensuring safety in schools and DepEd offices during emergencies.** Safety and emergency equipment will be procured and distributed to schools and DepEd offices.
- 6. **Enabling Regions and Divisions through the Provision of Program Support Funds.** This is the provision of funds to regions and divisions to support the implementation of DRRM, CCAM, EiE, and MHPSS initiatives for their office personnel and for the schools, teachers, non-teaching personnel, and learners.
- 7. Assessment of DRRM, CCAM, EiE, and MHPSS initiatives of the Department. This includes bi-annual planning and evaluation workshops to ensure the alignment of DRRM, CCAM, EiE and MHPSS initiatives across all levels of the Department, and to assess the progress was all levels of the Department.

on the implementation of these initiatives towards ensuring the safety and resiliency of learners, personnel, schools and offices.

It is submitted that the additional P45,307,281,896.22 for the Disaster Preparedness and Response Program discussed above is urgently needed for 2021 to address all the non-infrastructure damages inflicted by calamities from TY "Quinta" to TY "Ulysses" that all happened in November 2020, and to fully fund regular DepEd DRRM programs. The P51.26 billion herein proposed still excludes the amount proposed under the Aide Memoire on the Urgent Need for a Calamity-Related Repair and Reconstruction Fund (CRRF) for Classrooms Damaged by Various Calamities from 2016-2020.

Moreover, this proposal is critical to achieving the Department's long-term and overall goal of strengthening the resilience of the public education sector from all forms of disasters and emergencies.
